This Department of Agricultural Economics and Extension offers eight market driven programmes in agricultural economics, agribusiness, and agricultural education and extension. The programmes offered include two diploma, two undergraduate, two masters and two Doctor of Philosophy degree programmes.

All the programmes on offer are regionally and internationally recognized. The Department focuses on training and mentoring students to develop adaptive skills that have made our graduates highly competitive in the job market.
